#### **Solidarity: A Letter from our Executive Director**

T his year has been another exciting year for Missouri Jobs with Justice and for working people throughout the United States. We continue to see workers across Missouri and the country reevaluate priorities, understand the power of their collective voices, and demand corporations put people over profits. And you all have shown up in solidarity— attending collective actions, throwing community support behind workers forming unions, and helping us make our labor movement stronger and more multiracial and working class. Thank you for standing strong at every opportunity to promote workers' rights and economic and racial justice.

We also know that direct action from workers, while the most important way to flex our collective power, can't be our only strategy. We continue to work towards local and statewide policy gains. Pro-worker issues like increasing the minimum wage, expanding unemployment benefits, and passing earned paid sick leave are popular policies with Missourians but continue to be ignored by our elected officials.

Missouri also remains a very polarized and conservative state. Breaking through these attitudes takes patience, love, and clarity about why folks are making the choice to elect anti-worker and anti-democratic candidates and build enough trust to shift them into solidarity with a multiracial base of poor and working class Missourians. With over a year into our deep canvassing and organizing program we have knocked over 150,000 doors, engaging in conversations with working people across Missouri about wages, paid sick leave, the health of our democracy and other issues that are front of mind for working people in our state. These conversations break through the lies and distortions spewed by our opposition and orient voters toward a vision of the future—and of their own self-interest—that is rooted in multiracial solidarity and mutual thriving.

While it can be hard to hold onto hope, there are so many opportunities ahead to shift the conversation back to workers and an economy that works for everyone, not the few. But we need you to make it possible. We are figuring out new ways to come together, build relationships and align on values. It is giving us renewed energy and purpose, and leaders and institutions like yours make it possible. We urge all of our friends and supporters to recommit themselves to building an economy and democracy that works for all of us—Black, Brown & white, and to the continuing fight for Jobs with Justice.
